**PUBLIC HEARING**  
**SCHOOL BUILDING MAINTENANCE**  
**EXPENDABLE TRUST FUND**

In accordance with [RSA 198:20-c](#), Superintendent Corey provided an explanation of proposed expenditure(s) from the Brookline Maintenance Expendable Trust Fund.

Principals Molinari and Bouley identified several needed repairs/improvements for their respective buildings during the budget process. At the FY23 Budget Hearing, the Brookline School Board recommended that the funding source for these particular items be the Brookline Maintenance Expendable Trust. The voters approved the Board's recommendation during the 2022 voting session. Therefore, this is the official request to use the Expendable Trust for the following expenses. Noted was an additional identified need, the CSDA gym floor refinishing project, that was not part of the budget process.
